The roots of local responsibility for crime prevention seem to lie in Anglo-Saxon customs. Many of these were continued after 1066 by the Norman rulers who needed a system to control the largely Anglo-Saxon population. Every male over the age of 12 had to belong to a group of nine others, called a tithing.

The burial was found accidentally by children who had hung a rope-swing from a tree on the embankment above Mill Lane. As the children swung on the rope their feet constantly scuffed the ground creating a hollow which revealed a shallow grave.
